Proposed CIS: The Hollywood United Neighborhood Council (HUNC) supports efforts by the City of LA to streamline its disjointed planning process and plans such as the potential AI Fresco (AF) ordinance appear to be an attempt to do so. Because the AF proposal is so specialized, HUNC has concerns and recommendations regarding the program and process:

1. The original AF program was implemented in response to the COVID emergency to aid restaurants during the severe downturn of business, a program that HUNC has supported as a temporary measure during the pandemic. With the emergency now being lifted, it is unclear why there is a need for a permanent AF ordinance as procedures to implement outdoor dining currently exist.

2. The AF ordinance will be another layer of bureaucracy, further complicating the planning system due to the specialized nature of this program. The City's efforts at streamlining planning approval processes should be for the entire process and not for specialized, redundant programs.

3. HUNC recognizes that there is a value in AF dining but this proposed ordinance assumes that all outdoor dining areas are the same which is not the case. Each outdoor dining project should be separately reviewed and the Conditional Use Permit (CUP) process remain in effect.

4. Existing CUP's should remain in effect and not overridden by a new AF ordinance.

5. There is sense that this program has been forced through the system with minimum transparency and that Neighborhood Councils and stakeholders will be excluded from the input process now and for any future AF approvals. Doing so will subvert the program and could lead to abuses.

6. HUNC supports the letter and questions posed from LA PLUM of March 1, 2022.

After discussion Jim Van Dusen made the motion to approve the CIS. Rosalind Helfand seconded the motion.
