Hollywood Personnel Updates

Sgt. Danielle Lopez has left Hollywood. She had been the SLO Supervisor for the past year. She has been promoted to Sgt. II position at the LAPD Internal Affairs Division.

Season Nunez has joined the Hollywood Division as the new Patrol Captain. She will be starting June 2, 2026.

Angela La Riva is leaving the Hollywood Partnership BID for a job in law enforcement. She has accepted a Lieutenant position at a community college starting in June. She is also stepping down as the Hollywood CPAB Secretary. We thanked her for her partnership and wished her success in her new role.

Climate Action Plan

In April, Mayor Bass released her Climate Action Plan for Los Angeles. This plan has set goals to address climate change. It outlines how the City of LA will reduce emissions of greenhouse gasses, reduce water use and expanding parks and green spaces.

The plan calls for converting city buses to electric by 2028 and installing 120,000 EV chargers.

Another goal is to reduce the City of LA's reliance on imported water. LASAN and LADWP are partnering on a new wastewater treatment facility.

IV. QUESTIONS from meeting attendees:

Question: Any information about the annual LA Culture Festival & Carnival Parade that usually happens in Hollywood in June...it's always a traffic nightmare for area residents!

So far LAPD and CD13 haven't rec'd details yet for this year's event.

Note: their website has announced that 2026 Hollywood Carnival has been CANCELLED (due to funding issues and concerns about safety...)

Question: is LAPD putting any special plans together to address the rise in incidents of violence (like recent shooting at a San Diego Mosque) directed towards houses of worship?

Captain Chavez responded that they don't wait for events to have plans in place. The SLO's and Hollywood Officers are always vigilant - keeping their eyes open to threats. Be sure to keep close contact with your area SLO if you have specific concerns. Urgent threats should be reported using 9-1-1.

SLO Brian White commented that he and SLO Brett Cohen conduct a "surviving an active shooter" training for groups who request it. It's about 45 minutes to an hour long. They are happy to provide it. Contact them directly via email" 38074@lapd.online & 40760@lapd.online

Question: Any updates on the prostitution and human trafficking activity along Western Avenue?

Captain Chavez says that the majority of the activity is within the LAPD Olympic Division. Their main focus is on helping the female victims. They partner with "Journey Out" program. They also focus on enforcement.

Hollywood Blvd. Street Vendor Update

They continue to work on compliance to make sure the sidewalks (especially along Hollywood Blvd.) are safe for the public.

They made sure there was visibility (no canopies, no big busses parking along the Blvd.)

LAPD began with education and awareness efforts.

They are now in the enforcement / citation phase.

They have issued about 20 citations in the past few weeks.

Most of the vendors have made adjustments to be compliant.

They are going after counterfeit goods vendors and other illegal vendors.

They are not allowed to block entrances and driveways.

Question: what about the street vendors that line Highland Avenue during the Hollywood Bowl season?

Highland north of Franklin is outside of SLO Cohen's assigned area.

2. Review of 2/4/2026 (Working Group Meeting #26) Minutes (5 minutes)

3. Introductory Remarks (5 minutes)

J: Happy Passover. One person left, Kim Kevorkian moved to Woodland Hills. Cindy Cobb will be joining going forward.

4. Update Items (45 minutes)

a. PPD #320 Expansion Signage

J: Signs in purgatory for far too long [Cindy Cobb joined, introduced herself]. Signs are, to our understanding, printed as of March 31. In queue for installation. Begin installation on May 4th. There are a lot of signs to go in, unlikely that they will finish in one weekend. Staff in the Mayor's office was very helpful in getting these moved along. We had a meeting with the Mayor's office to advocate for concerns in Lake Hollywood. Mayor's Budget will be announced around 20th of April, CD4 advocated for resources in this area.

Cindy: Thank you! When enforcement starts, when do placards need to be purchased? Task for LHA Board to complete

CD4 Action Item: Bernadette will reach out to Felix about placards scheduling

Augusta: You mentioned a task force?

J: That is an ongoing conversation. We will get into that more with the Summer Deployment section. Problem with ongoing strategy - continuity of staffing, true with LADOT and LAPD. Coming up against a learning curve. SLO Mata's leadership helped with this in the past, but she has moved to a different area of Hollywood.

b. Mulholland Hwy Permanent Fencing ([23-0701](#))

J: BOE does not have new drawings for this. Structural drawings should be completed by the end of April. Mehmet will reach out to BOE. We do have funding for this, we would like to see this out of design.

Not confident in removing existing fencing without a permanent fence. Worried people will stop without a fence. Realize it is unsightly. The abatement effort is not aesthetically pleasing.

Chip: Take down fabric? We agreed we would look into that. Can that be taken down?

J: We had that conversation, they took down the panels that were most loose and free-flying. More have become loose. If there is a desire to remove all, it could be done. I'd like agreement from this group, as there are concerns about people stopping with no fabric.

Cindy: Is there a period of design review or public comment once the design is done?

J: That is why I have hesitation about altering the fence right now. We do not have a timeline. The immediate milestone is to see the design. We will bring that to this group of people. Also a precedent of site visits with this group. How quickly we move to contracting or construction - we cannot give a date.

Cindy: I think fabric is hideous. Can I take it to the LHA Board?

J: Yes

Chip: Maybe take down all of the fabric, if one section becomes problematic, add that panel back. Should we take a thumbs up/thumbs down?

J: In support of removing fabric, please raise your hand: 5? Opposed: 1?

c. Lake Hollywood Traffic Management Plan Next Steps

J: We talked about this last time. We cannot do this without a resolution that allows for this stretch of Canyon Lake Drive to have a HARD closure. Bhuvan and Crystal wrote the 1st pass. Now with Mehmet and the CD4 legislative team. Once CD4 agrees, it will go to the City Attorney for their review. Then to City Council, introduced, referred to the Transportation Committee, then back to Council. We will continue to engage with the community and this group. No timeline, Council is currently in recess. Aggressive hope - Mehmet and our team goes through next week, City Attorney week after, introduced to Council in May.

Augusta: Maybe before this is taken to the City Council and Transportation committee. This group has been every other month. Can you loop us into the City Attorney's decision before it goes to Council? We don't have a May meeting.

J: Let me sit on this **[CD4 Action Item: look up our posture on sharing draft legislation]**

Augusta: For this summer?

J: Ideally, some trial this summer is the most idealized version.

Augusta: Will residents be given access to Canyon Lake to access Burbank?

J: No

Augusta: I want that stated: that this is a hard closure.

J: Legislation that would give us the ability to do this and actual doing of this are two separate things. We want to make sure the community is in support of this. We will not close the streets without a discussion about it.

Steve: Plans to engage with the Neighborhood Councils? What are they?

J: Yes, but we are not there yet to discuss a specific plan.

Jason: When this idea came forward, it was a two step idea: closure married with a shuttle, allowing visitors to get to Lake Hollywood Park from a place in Hollywood. GPAB is in favor of that approach. If the closure moves forward in advance of a shuttling component, it is important to think through what those visitors will do. Encourage everyone to think about unintended consequences. CD4 team is mindful of this, but I am verbalizing this for the group. How can visitors not be guided to other neighborhoods?

J: Fair, Beachwood situation is an ongoing closure 7 days a week for now. Closures on Canyon Lake Drive would not be 7 days a week, they'd be seasonal and irregular. We have to be mindful of redirections, but the impacts may be less severe. But the idea of a shuttle is very much on the table, CM most preferred priority.

Cindy: Mindful of the fact, as the VP of Fire Safe Council, we should be cognizant Red Flag Days. It would be hard in the event of an emergency to evacuate on a Red Flag Day without hard closure. Once PPDs are in effect, there will be a bottleneck to Canyon Lake Drive. People will still come, fight over fewer spaces, park illegally. When you are talking about hard closures..when are those?

J: This would be augmenting the schedule for when we have deployed LADOT and LAPD to the area. It would be reflective of high tourism, holidays, summer, weekends.

Cindy: It does make sense. Would a shuttle run only on those days, or all days?

J: Let's table all shuttle discussions for now. A shuttle is not a part of the pilot program. If this is successful, incorporating a shuttle - we will explore.

Augusta: Suggest that if this passes, at Barham and Lake Hollywood, Beachwood/Franklin - have light up signs that say "no access."

J: Yes, those are in the plan.

Steve: How will we determine the success of closing the road?

J: Operationally, we can redirect people outside the neighborhood without adversely impacting another neighborhood. Give people knowledge that they cannot see the sign because the road is not passable.

d. Summer Deployment

J: Brief-ish. Our plan - we are committed to do what we did last summer. Memorial Day, 4th of July, 4th of July through Labor Day. We do not have funding yet. Next meeting in June, we would like to bring LAPD and LADOT - you can share what you have seen (with us moderating) to voice your concerns.

5. New Items (15 minutes)

Hollywood Sign & Western Griffith Park Action Plan Working Group

a. Billy Boman Filming (3/16 - 3/28)

J: Who saw this? Cahuenga East. This was fully permitted. Located on private property. When our office found out, we reached out to Mayor (Steve Kang) and FilmLA. Our concerns were this was an advertisement. FilmLA came around to the idea that it was not just a film shoot, but more of an ad. FilmLA said in future, things like this should be covered when not in use. We've seen an increase in permitted guerilla ads, like the Sydney Sweeney ad. We are actively talking with FilmLA and the Mayor. There is a permitted statue in Runyon Canyon, with a QR code on the statue. That takes it from a set piece for filming, which was permitted, to an ad. We are doing what we can to raise these issues.

Cindy: Billy B thing was a distraction, safety hazard. Sydney Sweeney - sign trust did not know it was happening.

J: Sign Trust and Chamber are their own thing. There is a permitting process for the likeness of the sign, the enforcement of that is their kettle of the fish.

Cindy: Weird that coordination was not made with the Sign Trust. As the World Cup is coming, the Olympics, lighting the sign, I'm concerned about, when we've lit the sign on purpose, turned into a kettle of fish.

J: Yes, that is why we are discussing this with FilmLA and the Mayor's office, there is an uptick in this activity. We can exert influence without having direct oversight.

b. No Smoking Sign Installation

J: No smoking signs in VHFSZ. CD4 has ordered signs that will be erected. We have not put this out to the broader community. If you would like to see these signs in a particular location - high traffic, not your personal corner (unless high traffic), near trail heads, VHFSZ, they must be installed in a location where there is an existing pole.

Lucy: How do we get to increase the fee if you are caught smoking? Enforcement? I saw someone smoking on a trail, saw someone from RAP, they were not interested in confronting a person who was smoking.

J: How many tickets has RAP issued? They are limited in number of rangers, probably limited. We are increasing messaging. Enforcement will remain a problem without a dedicated, robust Ranger force.

Augusta: Do we have access to LACC - no smoking signs with overgrown brush and trees in front of signs, specifically on Deronda - need someone from the city.

J: Give me a list. That is not a problem. I have the list from Jason from 2025.

Jason: Thank you, this is relatively modest for something that can make a big difference. Enforcement is more complicated, but signs will go a long way.

Hollywood Sign & Western Griffith Park Action Plan Working Group

J: Our pleasure. Installation of signs in the public right of way should not be a problem. We will have to get RAP buy-in to install on their property.

Linda: Signs on public right of way?

J: We do not have resources to dig poles, pour concrete. We need locations with existing infrastructure to install these signs. Should be in the public right of way where there is a pole.

Linda: Can we get signs from you if we have a location on private property?

J: Grey area, depends on location.
